

made to relocate the Connie Thrash McGoodwin Vocational Training Hub (CTM-Vocational Hub) to a transitional site, when the ongoing renovation is completed. We are continuing with fundraising goals to buy the land to build our campus community. •

Konah came to us in 2012 at 9yrs of age, nonverbal and crawling like a toddler. Rejected by her mother shortly after being born developmentally delayed, she has been cared for by her grandmother from birth. Her goal as she came to Bigma's Care Place Respite Care was to be appreciated.

Today, we are proud to announce that Konah now makes sounds and gestures to express herself; and can

stand and walk around all by herself. Her grandmother in appreciation attributed the accomplishment of her granddaughter to the opportunities that My Heart's Appeal (MHA) makes available giving Konah a chance that society had denied her. She went on to say that having other children to play with like herself and being in a loving caring environment allowed Konah to feel accepted with a sense of belonging.



Morris United Methodist Church, Oklahoma - USA



















MHA Celebrates World Down Syndrome Day in Liberia, West Africa - 2016



2016 Theme: "My Friends, My Community" - The benefits of inclusive environments for today's children and tomorrow's adults

March 21, 2016 marks the 11th anniversary of World Down Syndrome Day (WDSD), which is a global awareness day and is officially observed by the United Nations and sponsored by Down Syndrome International of the United Kingdom. The date signifies the uniqueness of the triplication (trisomy) of chromosome 21. This is Liberia's fourth celebration and My Heart's Appeal is honored to be its representative.

We want to get people talking about WDSD on March 21, celebrated March 15 in Liberia. Down Syndrome International invites everyone across the world to wear LOTS OF SOCKS to raise awareness on (WDSD). 




