



Over 100 clients and their families receive respite care one day a month. Forty of their clients receive life skill and work skills training during the regular school year and thirty will begin the special needs day program soon. It is the only program in Liberia, West Africa serving families with intellectual and developmental delays.

In May, 2016, My Heart's Appeal Parent Association was founded. The parents joined in as we broke ground for the last phase of the construction for our ten room facility of our vocational hub.

The pilot phase of the Connie Thrash McGoodwin Vocational Training Hub, the Special Needs Day Program and the Al & Nancy Williams Bakery & Café shop opens, September 2016.

My Heart's Appeal First of Five Hubs Named

On September 19, 2011, our office opened in Oklahoma City. The first official correspondence on that day was made to Dale Rogers Training Center (DRTC) which then prompted a meeting with the Executive Director, Connie Thrash McGoodwin, M.Ed. at the end of that week. We now celebrate five years of partnership with DRTC and want to extend to the Board of Directors, Executive Director and Staff of DRTC, our heartfelt thanks and appreciation for welcoming My Heart's Appeal, Inc. (MHA) to Oklahoma City with your expression of love and support.

MHA realized the value of Dale Rogers Training Center, the oldest and largest community vocational training and employment center for people with disabilities in Oklahoma, USA; and planned and adopted the concept to "develop services and products to sell to the public instead of always holding out an open hand."

As then DRTC Board President, Marc Edwards, stated in the 2008-2010 Biennial Report "...as our executive director of almost 30 years likes to say, " Dale Rogers is just getting started." We join in applauding Connie Thrash McGoodwin in her efforts to make DRTC one of its kind in serving people with disabilities.

With great honor and pride, we named our vocational training hub after Connie Thrash McGoodwin, a trailblazer who has spent her entire career paving the way and altering the minds of society and eventually proving the fact that everyone can be productive, if given a chance.

Recently, I read an article by Dave Willis, "7 Things Happy People Do Every Day." The more I read of it the more I thought of our students at My Heart's Appeal in Liberia. I'll share only 2 of those traits with you this time...but remember: **BDAC!** (Better Days Are Coming!)

Willis writes: "The simplest and most effective way to improve your own happiness is to "<u>learn from truly happy people."</u> When our students and the younger children gathered at Bigma's Respite Care, my first impression was to note how happy they were simply to arrive...and we hadn't even started the activities yet!

1. "Encourage others instead of criticizing them." Of course, our teaching and volunteers do exactly that in the attention they give to each one. As staff and volunteers,

we lined up at the gate as the bus arrived with the children. Each one was greeted by name and a hug. The ritual was repeated at the end of our time together...line up...call each by name...bless them with a hug. No wonder during the day these children follow the example of encouraging each other at work at the computer or in the garden.

2. "Be at peace with not having everything 'figured out'." Another of the many lessons I learned is that the intellectually challenged do not exhibit the obsession to figure out every action, situation or person they meet. Acceptance is the root from which grace grows. Perhaps you are a little like me when I feel most stressed. It is usually because I am trying to figure out everything on my own. These students rely on each other and their caregivers to know what needs to be accomplished. And toward that end, they are considerably more faithful than many of us. Our staff knows that God has a plan for them.

Dave Willis: "The Bible never once says, 'figure it out,' but over and over it says, 'have faith." God already has it all figured out for us."

The more I come to know and understand the mission of My Heart's Appeal, the happier I am to strive to give them the one thing they may lack...opportunity.


