Pasture for the Sheep Fundraiser

My Heart's Appeal (MHA) continues Phase One of its' fund-raising drive: Land Purchase.

With the vision to incorporate vocational and teacher training, residential and recreational facilities, a commercial center and other community services to the special needs community, MHA has secured 100 acres of land, situated at Giah's Town, Marshall Territory in lower Margibi County, Liberia, West Africa.

A fundraiser drive, Pasture for the Sheep, began November 28, 2012. The goal is to raise \$ 300,000.00 to cover the cost of the land, cornerstone, probate deed, surveying, clearing and

securing the property location.

Construction and/or erection of the facilities will launch Phase Two of our next fundraising drive.

Plans are underway for cost calculations for the next phase. Our goal is to have the facility near completion by 2016 for our twenty -year anniversary.

We trust that we can count on you to make a difference in the life of an intellectually-disabled individual in West Africa. Thank you for your support!

MHA international head office was officially launched on October 25, 2012 in Oklahoma City. As the invited guests commenced their tour, they were ushered into a new added office space that had just been acquired on October 1, 2012.

CEO's Reflections...

August 8, 2011, Mrs. Ellen Johnson-Sirleaf, President of the Republic of Liberia, signed a document into Law adding Special Education to the Liberian Education System. Mrs. Major was on the first plane into Liberia to begin filing papers to incorporate MHA as a non-governmental organization in Liberia. The papers were approved and handed her on the 19th of August 2011.

The second week in January, 2012, Mrs. Major was back in Liberia the second time scouting the different neighborhoods in and around Monrovia and its environs, along with volunteers to

locate families with children who had special needs. She arranged and trained volunteers how to conduct an initial interview to determine the apparent disability of the incoming clients. At this point, reliance was heavily weighted on the parents, since most of the children and young adults had never been tested.

The feasibility study had now been completed in Liberia, which ascertained the need to initiate training and employment services for teens and adults with disabilities.

Alvinia Federwitz, who introduced Mrs. Major, went on to declare, not only was Mrs. Major concerned with her sister, who has Down Syndrome, but for all other Liberian young people who do not have the chance to be profitable in their own country, because they do not have the opportunity to be educated. ☺



As long as there is a Liberian who has breath and are of age to work, they should be encouraged to work says, **Varbah Gayflor**, Minister of Labor, who attended the program among others. She thanked MHA for providing services that would enable the special needs population to be productive. ☺

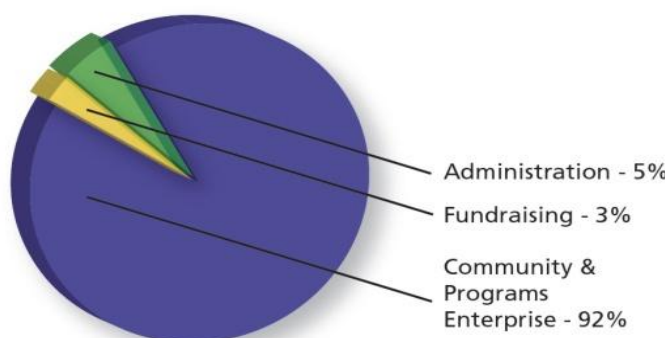

MHA Programs and Projects

MHA is presently self-funded and does not have a funding source yet. We have on our website several planned awareness and fundraising events to help further our goals and objectives.

Planning for our literacy clinic in partnership with Towson Reading Clinic in Maryland and vocational programs with Dale Rogers Training Center in Oklahoma City, both in the U.S.A., are on the way to begin soon in Liberia.

Walk-a Thon for the Intellectually Disabled Youngster in West Africa will begin in late spring of 2013, as a third party campaign to create awareness for our cause. Students with and without disabilities, parents, friends, and the community in the range of the Corporation, will be encouraged to walk a certain distance and give a contribution for each mile or lap in support of MHA providing help for the

intellectually disabled youngster in West Africa. Proceeds will go towards Bigma's Care Place - Respite Care.

MHA provides training programs and opportunities to teenage and adult persons who have a primary diagnosis of intellectual disability. Persons served may also have other developmental or physical disabilities in addition to intellectual disability.

Testing methods have various cutoff points for the diagnosis of intellectual disability. These can range from an IQ of 70 to an IQ of 80. However, IQ is not the only criteria for diagnosis. A person with intellectual disability also exhibits impaired adaptive behavior.

Psychologists are needed to help with testing of our target group of which most have not been clinically tested.

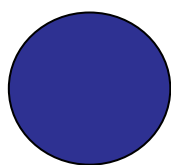

However, there was one major problem by ratio of our target population (fifteen - adulthood), to the need of mothers who had children from three months old to fourteen years of age.

Most or all of this sample group of children had never been to school because of their apparent disabilities. The mothers complained about having

no help and that they were the only care givers of their children.

MHA then decided to offer a community service program to cater to this group as well. Mrs. Major then made a third trip and July 21, 2012, MHA launched Bigma's Care Place - Respite Care, modeled after Hannah's Promise-Church of the Servant. ☘
