elderly people living with disabilities. Ms. Ms. Major made the statement over the weekend at the St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Gaye Town, Old Road, where her organization, in partnership with the Ministry of Education (MOE), hosted Christmas party for children and elderly people living with disabilities. According to her, teenagers and adults, especially people living with disabilities, need more attention because they are almost like venerable people in society. She observed that children and people living with disabilities are given less attention, most especially in Liberia, something she described as total discrimination. "Most of the children and elderly people including those with disabilities only need love and care because they are part of society; love and care help these people live a better life," Madam Major noted. According to her, her organization provides

training program, parental care for children and opportunities to teenagers as well as adults who have a primary diagnosis of intellectual disability. At the same time, Madam Major has commended the Minister of Education, Etmonie David Tarpeh, for the level of support in helping to a successful Christmas party for the children and others. According to her, the organization normally visits communities where children and people with disabilities are facing challenges to identify with them through distribution of assorted items. Meanwhile, some volunteers and staff of the organization have described the event as love and passion for people with disabilities, stressing the need for other organizations in the country to prioritize the issue of showing love and care to children and people with disabilities.
