She founded MHA in 1996, and it was inaugurated in Baltimore, Maryland, in 2001. Lovetie Major in **A Chance to Learn** tells a heart touching story about the journey of Titema, (her sister) and her struggles and triumphs of overcoming the obstacles of having a learning disability.

The documentary will lead you on a journey of understanding of one Sister's love, commitment and vow to enrich her sibling's life by providing her with an opportunity to learn. It is both inspiring and uplifting and it will leave you with an enlightened understanding of how children with disabilities can embrace learning and be productive.
